



## **Using Green Screen Wizard**

- 1. Take a picture in front of the green screen. Ensure that the entire subject is in front of the screen and that they are not wearing any green articles of clothing.
- 2. Plug the camera into the computer, or alternatively, take the SD memory card out of the camera and plug it into the SD card reader, which can then be plugged into the computer.
- 3. At this point, iPhoto will launch on the iMac. Select the photo that you would like to use and click 'Import' in iPhoto to save the file to the computer (will likely go to the Pictures folder).
- 4. Click 'Edit' in iPhoto in order to crop the image. Select the Crop tool, and crop the photo so that only the green screen and the subject are showing in the photo. Click 'Done' to complete the crop.
- 5. Close iPhoto and launch 'Green Screen Wizard' software (icon located on the dock at the bottom of the desktop).
- 6. On the 'Home' tab of the software, choose 'Load Foreground' to import your photo, which will be located in the Pictures folder.
- 7. On the same tab, choose 'Load Background' to import a background picture for your green screen photo. The Green Screen Wizard software includes over 700 hi-res backgrounds, from famous locations to abstract images. These can be found in the 'Backgrounds' folder. Alternatively, images can be found online and downloaded for use as a background.
- 8. Select the 'Adjustment' tab to edit the scale and position of the foreground photo. Use the slider at the bottom of the window to adjust the scale, and click and drag the box within the border to adjust the position.
- 9. Once the scale and position are set, return to the 'Home' tab and click on the 'Adjust Image' button in order to clean up any lines or blemishes that can result from creases and wrinkles in the green screen. Typically the first or second choice on the list will be the cleanest.
- 10. Select the 'Save' button to save your image. Create a filename and save to an external storage device.
