This week's activities: Create a Constellation - Constellation Story


Create a Constellation

Suggested Materials:

- Black/Coloured paper
- Chalk
- Ruler (optional)
- Scissors (optional)
- Flashlight (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Using chalk, draw your constellation on the paper. Find one in the eResources below or use your imagination to create a new one. Does your constellation have many stars? Does it take the shape of an animal? A human? Something else?
- 2. You can use the ruler to help you draw a light line of chalk between your stars to make your constellation clearer.

- Paper


Directions:


Constellations often have stories attached to them. Orion was a great hunter and the Great Bear was a woman who was turned into a bear. What is the story of your constellation?





