



SPECTACULAR SNOWFLAKES

Bring the snow inside but stay warm and dry with these snowy activities.

This week's activities: Paper Snowflakes – Paper Towel Snow

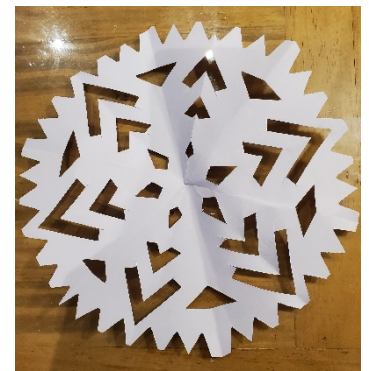
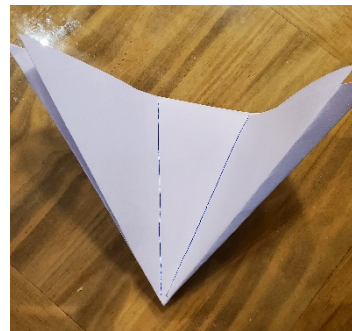
Paper Snowflakes

Suggested Materials:

- Square paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Ruler (optional)

Directions:

1. Fold paper in half on a diagonal.
2. Fold it in half again to make a triangle.
3. Fold it in thirds. Cut the overlapping points so you have one, tall triangle.
4. Cut random shapes out of the edges. Triangles, squares, half circles – whatever shapes you want.
5. Carefully unfold your paper and discover what your snowflake looks like.



Paper Towel Snow

Suggested Materials:

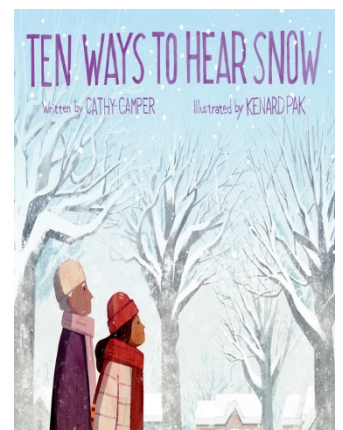
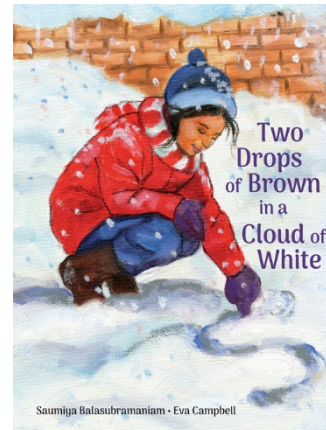
- ½ cup baking soda
- 3 tablespoons white vinegar
- 1 paper towel
- Scissors
- Bowl

Directions

1. Cut your paper towel into small pieces and put in bowl.
2. Add baking soda to the paper towel and stir.
3. Slowly add vinegar to the mixture and mix with your hands.
4. Can you make a snowball? If you wait a while, is it easier to shape?
