This week's activities: Honeycomb - Folded Butterfly

# Honeycomb

### **Suggested Materials:**

- Paper towel roll
- Yellow paper
- Black marker (or crayon)
- Glue (or tape)
- Scissors



#### **Directions:**


Honeybees use beeswax and pollen to make their hives. Each cell is used to store food or baby bees. Here's how you can make a hive:

- 1. Cut the paper towel roll into  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch thick sections. Bend them in half, then bend them in half the other way to make a diamond shape.
- 2. Arrange the honeycombs in a beehive shape on the yellow paper. When you're happy with the design, glue or tape them in place and let dry.
- 3. Draw some bees around your hive.

# **Folded Butterfly**

### **Suggested Materials:**

- Coloured paper 8½" x 11"
- Pipe cleaners
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Coloured markers




#### **Directions**

- 1. Fold one or two sheets of paper into two-inch folds, then fan it. Try combining different colours.
- 2. Once folded, take a pipe cleaner folded in half and wrap it around the centre. Separate the open end and curl it to look like an antenna.


