Make A Bingo Game

Build a Bingo game using the template on the next page (or draw one yourself.) Come up with some ideas for a Bingo game with a Canadian twist. You can either draw the ideas onto the board, or search through magazines, newspapers etc. to cut and paste.

Suggested Materials:

- Pencil
- Crayons/markers
- Paper
- Bingo template (see next page.) If you can't print one you can also draw one following the template provided.)



Now it's time to brainstorm:

When you think of Canada what comes to mind?

Here are some ideas to get you started:

- Hockey
- Maple Syrup
- Maple Leaf
- Loonies

List at least 30 different items that make you think of Canada.

Add them to your Bingo templates, either by drawing or cutting out pictures from magazines and newspapers and attaching them. Mix up the pictures to make sure that everyone playing does not have the same board!



Next, find items in your house to use as game pieces, such as pennies, LEGO pieces, or bits of paper.

Have a grown-up write on paper all your ideas. Cut out the ideas, put them in a jar or a hat and pull out one at a time. When they call out the item, the players cover that spot on their Bingo card. Try to get five in a row and be the first to yell out **BINGO!**
