This week's activities: DIY Dinosaur – Dino Egg

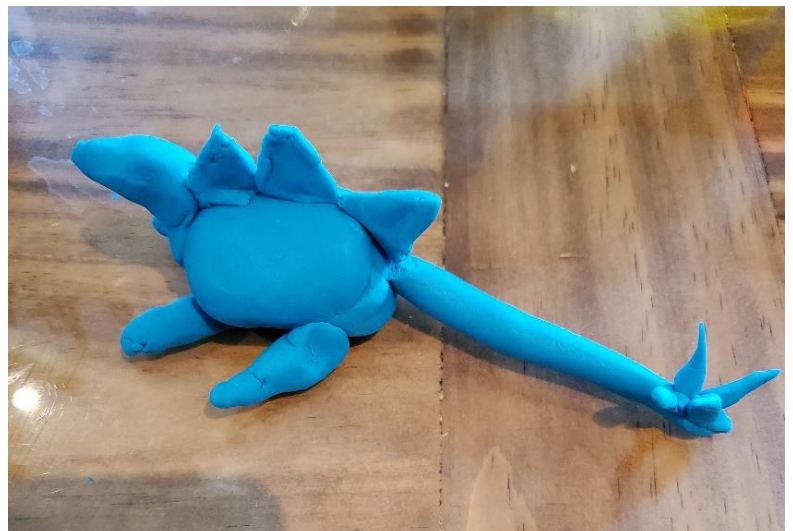
DIY Dinosaur

Suggested Materials:

- Playdough
- A picture of your favourite dinosaur (or use your imagination to make up a dinosaur.)

Directions:

Use your playdough to make your favourite dinosaur. Does your dinosaur have spikes? Plates? Two legs or four? Can you get your dinosaur to stand on two legs?



Dino Egg

Suggested Materials:

- Balloon
- Small dinosaur
- Water
- Spray bottle

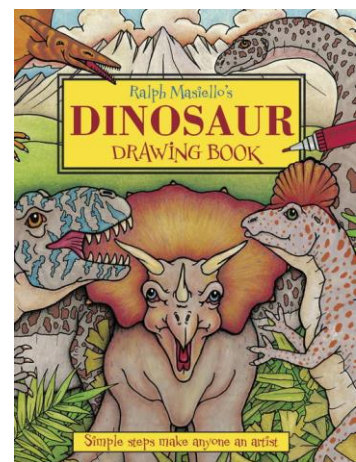
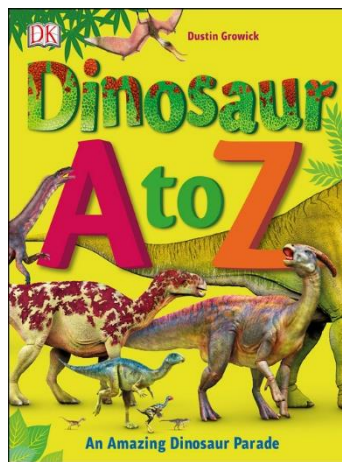
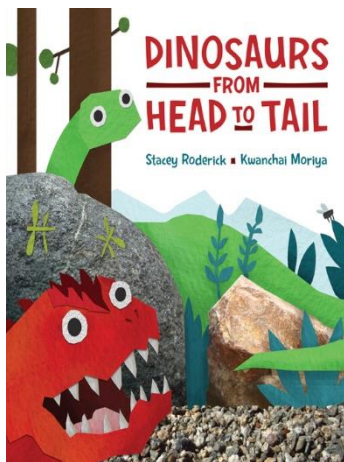
Directions:

Open a balloon as wide as you can at the top and place the dinosaur inside. Fill the balloon with water and tie. Place in the freezer for a few hours. When frozen, remove the balloon and you should have a dinosaur egg. Fill your spray bottle with hot water and spray the egg to see your baby dinosaur hatch!
