- Flextangle templates
- Crayons, pencil crayons or markers
- Scissors

# **Preparation**


• Watch the YouTube video with instructions for <u>making a flextangle</u> in order to guide and assist participants during the program

### **Implementation**


- 1. Distribute the flextangle template to participants
- 2. Participants should colour and draw designs in their flextangles and then follow the numbered instructions

### **Book Suggestions**



- 1. Cut out the flextangle by cutting along the outside border
- 2. Colour your flextangle using the following pattern guide:




3. Crease all the dashed lines by folding them on their face and then unfolding



4. Crease all the diagonal solid lines by folding them on their back and then unfolding



- 5. Gently fold the paper lengthwise to match dot to dot and form a tube
- 6. Add glue on the tab marks and press together



7. Add glue to the end tabs, tuck each one into the open end of the tube, and then press to seal
