How we read to children is as important as how often we read to them.

No matter what your child's age, reading together — or shared reading — is the single most important activity you can do to help your child get ready to read. Engage your child in back-and-forth conversations about the books you read. Children learn more words when they have the opportunity to respond to questions. If English is not your first language, speak to your child in the language you know best. This allows you to explain things to your child more fluently.


