Northern Lights


Suggested Materials:

- Pencil
- Eraser
- Crayons (or pencil crayons, watercolour paint, chalk)
- Cardboard (to make a stencil)
- Scissors
- Paper




Directions:


- 1. Make an outline of a mountain or some trees on a piece of cardboard and cut it.
- 2. Use your pencil to trace the outline of the landscape along the bottom of your paper.
- 3. Colour or paint your landscape a dark colour such as black or navy blue.
- 4. The colours of the Northern Lights are usually greens, pinks, purples and yellows. You can choose these colours, or whatever colours you like.
- 5. Using your cardboard stencil as a starting point, use your lightest colour to colour up towards the sky.
- 6. Move up your stencil, choose your next colour and blend it into the first. Keep going until you reach the top of the page.
- 7. Colour your night sky a dark colour.
- 8. Enjoy your Aurora Borealis.





