This week's activities: Natural Paint Brushes - Painting with Water

## **Natural Paint Brushes**

Try painting with some unusual tools.

## **Suggested Materials:**

- Small sticks (the size of a paint brush)
- Outdoor materials such as flowers, leaves, grasses
- Elastics or string



- Tablecloth or newspaper to cover the area
- Blank paper

### **Directions:**

- 1. Find small sticks, flowers, leaves and grasses in your backyard or neighbourhood.
- 2. Lay out the tablecloth/newspaper to prevent any mess.
- 3. Attach the materials to the small sticks with an elastic or string.
- 4. Dip the brushes into paint and try painting on blank paper to see the new designs you can make.

# **Painting with Water**

No paint? No worries. Paint with water.

## **Suggested Materials:**

- Plastic cup
- Water

- Construction paper
- Paintbrush (No paintbrush? No problem. Make brushes with flowers, leaves, grasses etc.)
- \*Alternative Canvases: Wooden or cement fences, decks or porches



#### **Directions:**

- 1. Fill your plastic cup with room-temperature water.
- 2. Place your construction paper on a table or countertop.
- 3. Dip brush or fingers in water.
- 4. Create art.





